

- Obtaining a VOE (Verification of Enrollment) needed to attend
   Driver's Education classes & to take the driver's test for a driver's license.


## 90% Rule Attendance For Credit

- A student falls below 90% on the 10th absence in a semester.





#### MUSTANG FAMILY BELEBRATION / SHOUT OUT

This week, we feature Dr. Martinez, a teacher in our English Department. Dr. Martinez started running in January 2021 as a way to maintain her weight loss. In 2019-2020, she lost a total of 26 lbs. In August of 2020, her doctor recommended that she start exercising so that she could maintain the weight loss. Being amid the pandemic, she started researching the best options for her. She came across the running app, "Start Running." In January 2021, she started running only minutes per day. It was a challenge. In June of 2021, she started training for a virtual 5K (3.1 miles) to remember the victims of September 11th. She trained over the summer. Dr. Martinez ran two 5Ks-one on Sept. 10 and the second on Sept. 11. This month, October, she started training for a 10K (6.2 miles) race. Her virtual race is scheduled for Saturday, December 18. Running has helped in so many ways-she feels less stress, eats healthier, and she has maintained her weight loss. Dr. Martinez currently runs about 3-4 times per week. Some days are easier than others and some days it's really hard. Dr. Martinez remembers why she started and that keeps her going.
